





Mornington Bowling Club

The State Mens and Ladies singles entries close on 6th January with round one on 19th January. The fours entries close on 28th January with round one on 5th of February with a night Game. We had one entry for the ladies pairs and two entries for the men's pairs. Gloria and Paula made it through the first round but were defeated in the second unfortunately. 

I was reading through some old articles by John Roberts from Bowls Victoria and came across this piece of trivia. We often use the phrase 'jack high' but do we really know what it means? Below is Johns' determination from the laws. Do you know what 'bowl in front' or 'bowl behind' looks like?

"So where is the bowl when is it truly Jack High? The Laws of the Sport define Jack High as: when the nearest part of a bowl is in line with and at the same distance from the mat line as the nearest part of the jack. (C.26, page12, 3rd Edition Crystal Mark) This diagram clearly shows a bowl jack high or jack level. The arrow indicates the direction of play."
